After discussion, it was agreed that Cllr. Dixon and Cllr. Eyre-Jackson contact other identified contractors to arrange tenders for the contract. Clerk is to email the specification to Cllr. Eyre-Jackson. A further meeting will be held at the end of May when quotations are to hand.
